Taking Pride in our History and Preserving Property for Generations to Come: Vandalism at the Gazebo

We have been fortunate to live in a community where historic treasures from our past have been preserved for us to enjoy today. Those that have gone before us, saw the value of leaving something for the future. Now it is our turn to do the same for those that follow us.

Over the past few months there have been various acts of vandalism in the public space around the library; most specifically in the gazebo. The gazebo has become an idyllic symbol in our community and was preserved from the days of the Great Cambridge Fair. Sadly, what began as small issues such as littering, has progressed to disturbing, graphic images being drawn on the columns, and most recently the destruction of the lattice along the bottom of this historic structure. Mr. Don Record generously gave his time and materials to build the lattice framing a few years ago and it was very disheartening to see his hard work be destroyed.

In small communities such as ours, each one of us has a duty to protect and preserve historic structures. It is imperative that community members stay vigilant. If you see anyone doing anything improper, please report it to the authorities. Despite the Police Department's best efforts and the attempts of library staff to watch the public space outside, they have not been able to catch anyone in the act of vandalizing the property. The village board will be discussing proactive solutions to address this problem at our next board meeting on Wednesday, August 1st at 7:00 PM.

Prescription Medication Disposal Drop Box at Police Station

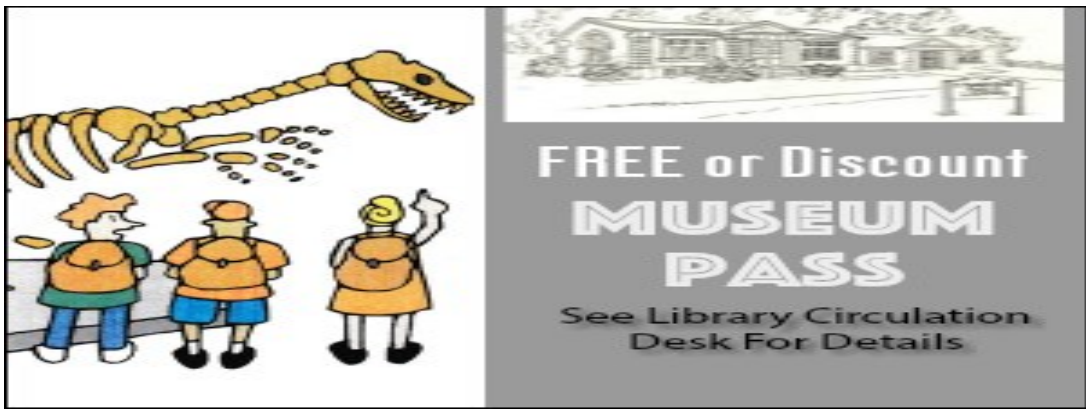
Abuse of prescription drugs is a major public health problem in New York State. The New York State Medication Drop Box Program will expand the options currently available for households to dispose of discontinued, expired or unwanted medications in a manner that considers public health, as well as the environment. The box is currently in the lobby of the Cambridge Police Station located at 56 North Park Street and maybe accessed by the public anytime day or night when an officer is in attendance or, if no officer is in attendance, simply go to the Village Clerk office during normal business hours and they will escort you to the box.
